## CENTURIA VILLAGE BOARD MINUTES May 13, 2019

The Regular Village Board meeting was called to order by President Rod Peterson, with everyone present. Steve Sylvester made the motion, seconded by Tom Boettcher, to approve the agenda. Upon voice vote, the motion carried.

Rod welcomed newly elected Trustee, Chuck Ellsworth to the Board.

Polk County's new Administrator, Nick Osborne was in to introduce himself to the Board. He is hoping to have a good working relationship with the Municipalities.

The Personnel Committee had met on April 24 to address police issues.

Katie had been to the Library Board meeting and reported that they are working on a few new things for Memory Days. The afterschool program is doing great, even with the warmer weather. The Book Exchange at Sophie's Manor is going well. A bid for carpet and painting has been approved. Effective June 6, 2019, the Library Board is making the Position of Library Director a full time position. There will be no changes in staff.

Police Chief Eric Jorgensen provided the police report with no concerns.
